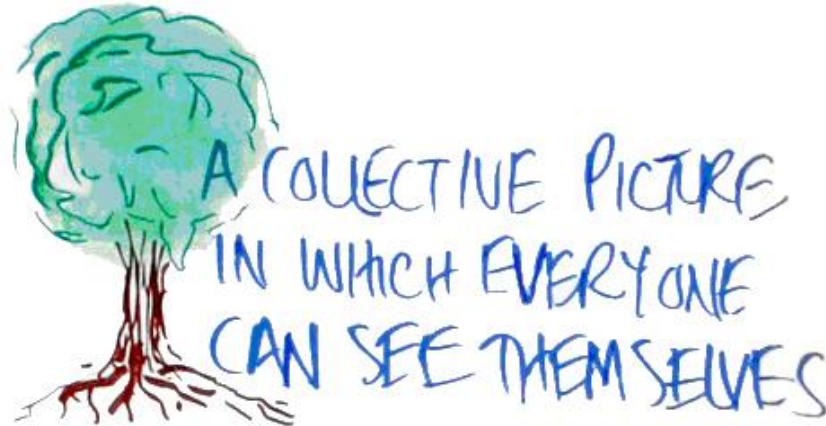

Comprehensive Community Planning (CCP)

- CCP is a First Nations' driven initiative
- Process that engages community members in planning and implementing the long-term vision of their community
- Includes development of goals, objectives and a plan of action to meet the vision
- Community-based, community-driven

Indigenous Community Development National Strategy – Four Pillars

- Pillar 1** – Support community-driven, nation-based initiatives and capacity building
- Pillar 2** – Support Indigenous Community to Community Learning
- Pillar 3** – Build and strengthen collaboration and partnerships within and across government departments to implement priorities identified by Indigenous communities
- Pillar 4** – Strengthen government’s awareness of cultural diversity



CCP in BC Region

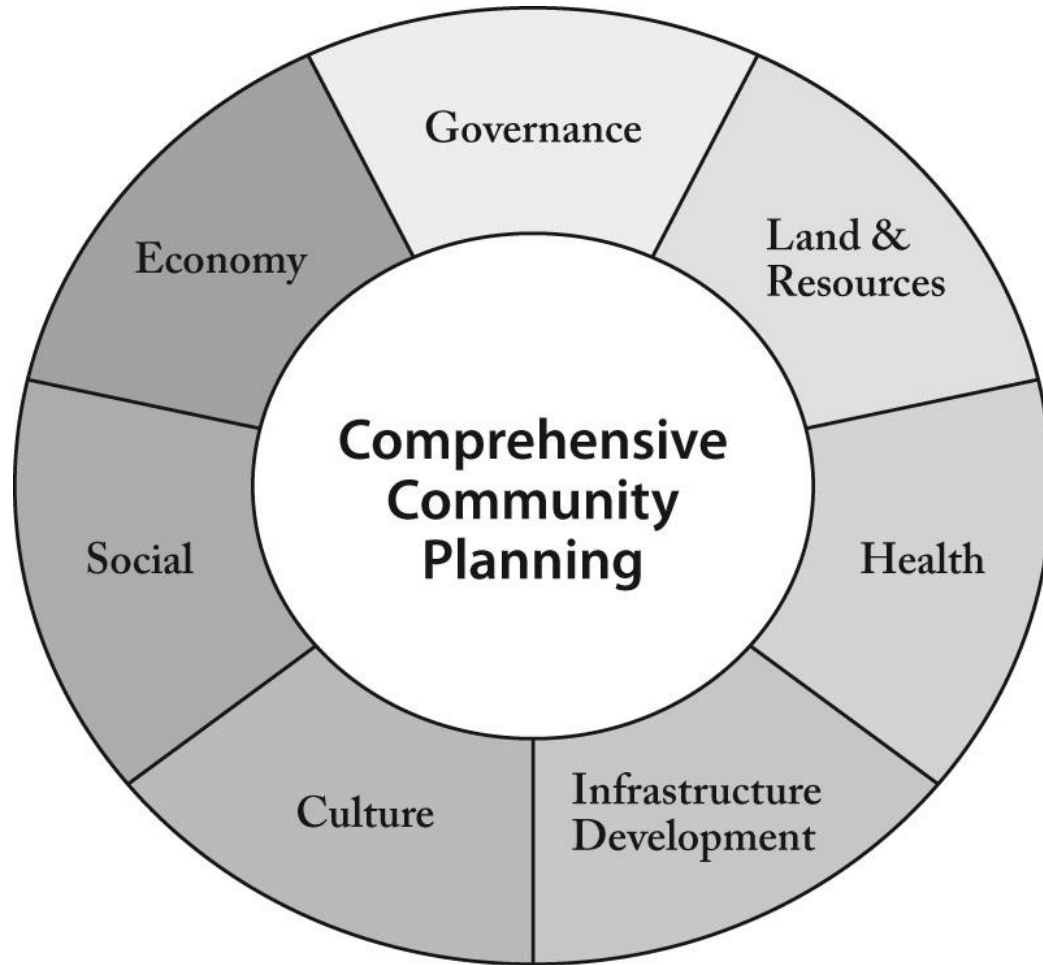
Indigenous Community Development National Strategy – Four Pillars

• **Pillar 1** – Comprehensive Community Planning

- CCP is a community driven, nation based planning process
- Empower the community to create its own vision for the future
- 97 CCPs funded
- 46 CCPs completed

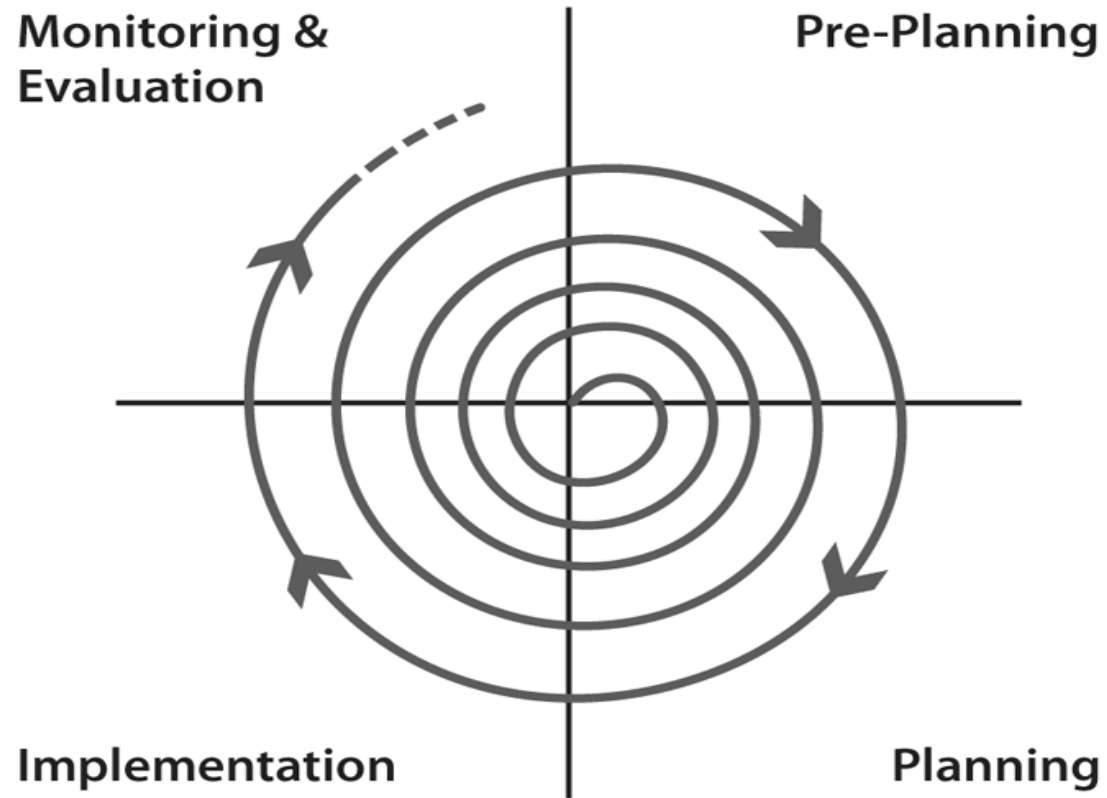


Key Elements of CCP



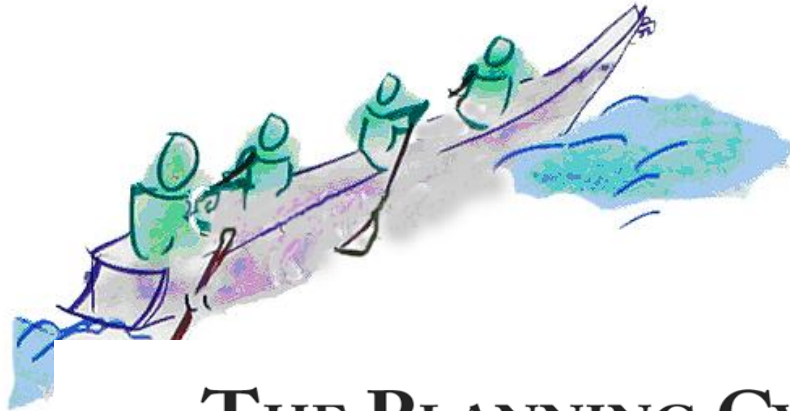


Key Elements of CCP

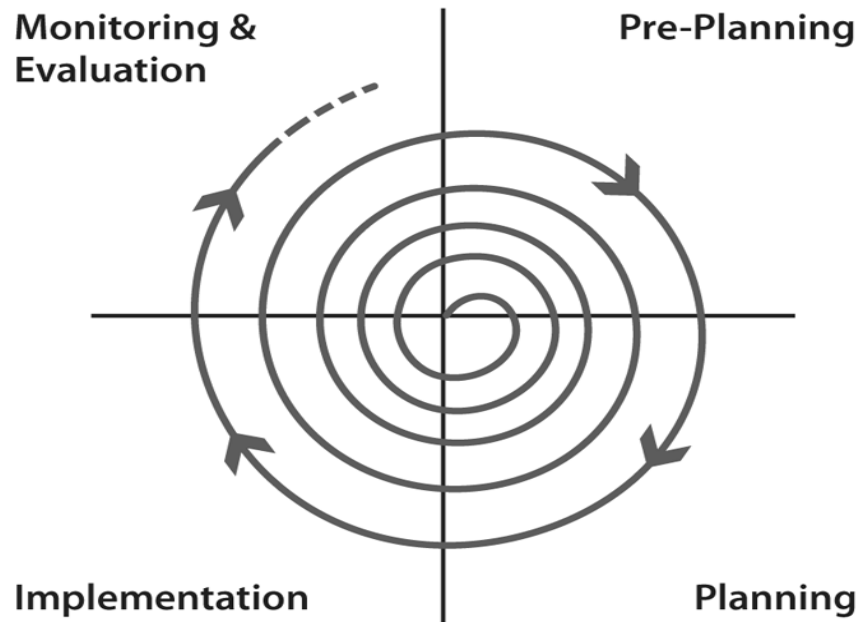




Applying the Planning Cycle

Key Elements of CCP

Benefits of CCP:

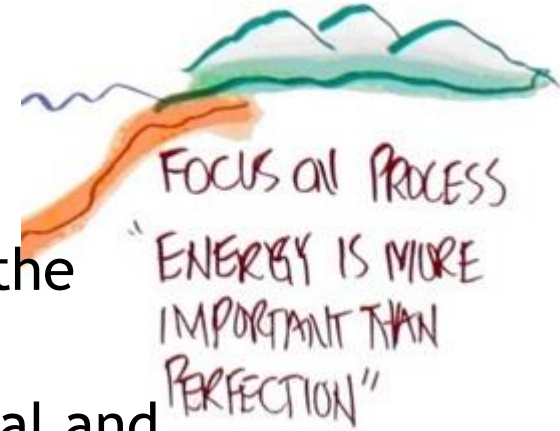
- ✓ Enables community to define a **vision** for the future
- ✓ Guides development, **aligning resources** with priorities
- ✓ Reinforces community **values**
- ✓ Provides opportunity for community **healing**
- ✓ Acts as a building block towards **self governance**
- ✓ Exemplifies **transparent** governance
- ✓ Builds **capacity**
- ✓ Facilitates **intergovernmental** investments



Key Elements of CCP

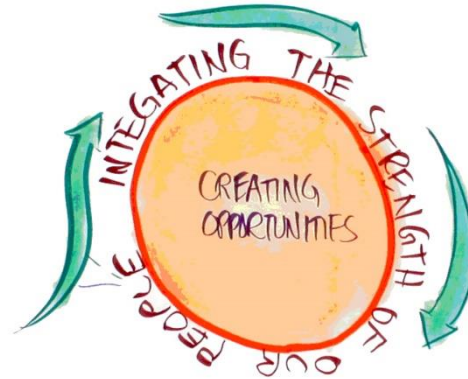
Lessons learned:

- CCP entails long timeframes
- The process is important, not just the product/plan
- Engaging membership is both critical and challenging
- Consultants need to be ‘managed’
- Building partnerships is advantageous
- Successes are to be celebrated
- Must plan how to keep the plan ‘alive’
- Link the Treaty process as appropriate with long-term planning and vice versa
